## **Adult Scholarship Information**

Please read the following before completing the application form (on page two).

- Scholarships are available to those who have been a PAL member in good standing for one year or more at the time of application.
- You can apply as many times as you like, however eligibility occurs every other year from the year of the first scholarship award.
- Scholarship application should be submitted at least 30 days prior to the date needed.
- The scholarship must be used only for workshops and materials related to the workshop. (Scholarship funds cannot be retroactively applied to workshops or supplies.)
- Include three samples of work you have completed within the last two years to familiarize the Scholarship Committee with your artwork. Digital images, photographs or a link to work contained on a personal website are acceptable. (Digital images can be emailed or sent via postal mail on a cd.)
- Describe your current artwork and how the grant will make an impact or difference.
- Upon receipt of a scholarship, you agree to give a short presentation at a monthly PAL meeting about your experience and how the grant was used.
